- What is an alarm?

A mechanism for informing an operator of an abnormal process condition for which an operator action is required.

Alarm Management

- processes and practices for:
 - determining, and
 - documenting,
 - designing,
 - monitoring,
 - maintaining alarm messages

Alarm History

- Poor alarm management has been identified as one of the major causal factors.
- basic alarm management started during WWII
- In 1979 the Three Mile Island nuclear power plant accident had poor alarm displays as a contributing factor.

Early Specifications

- process industry has developed guidelines and standards over the past 30+ years
- 1960 the Instrument Society of America released *ISA_RP18 Specifications and Guides for the Use of General Purpose Annunciators*.
- latest evolution of this document is ANSI/ISA-18.2-2009
- Abnormal Situation Management Consortium was formed in 1994. The consortium's purpose was to study a number of plant incidents where alarms had been identified as a causal factor.
